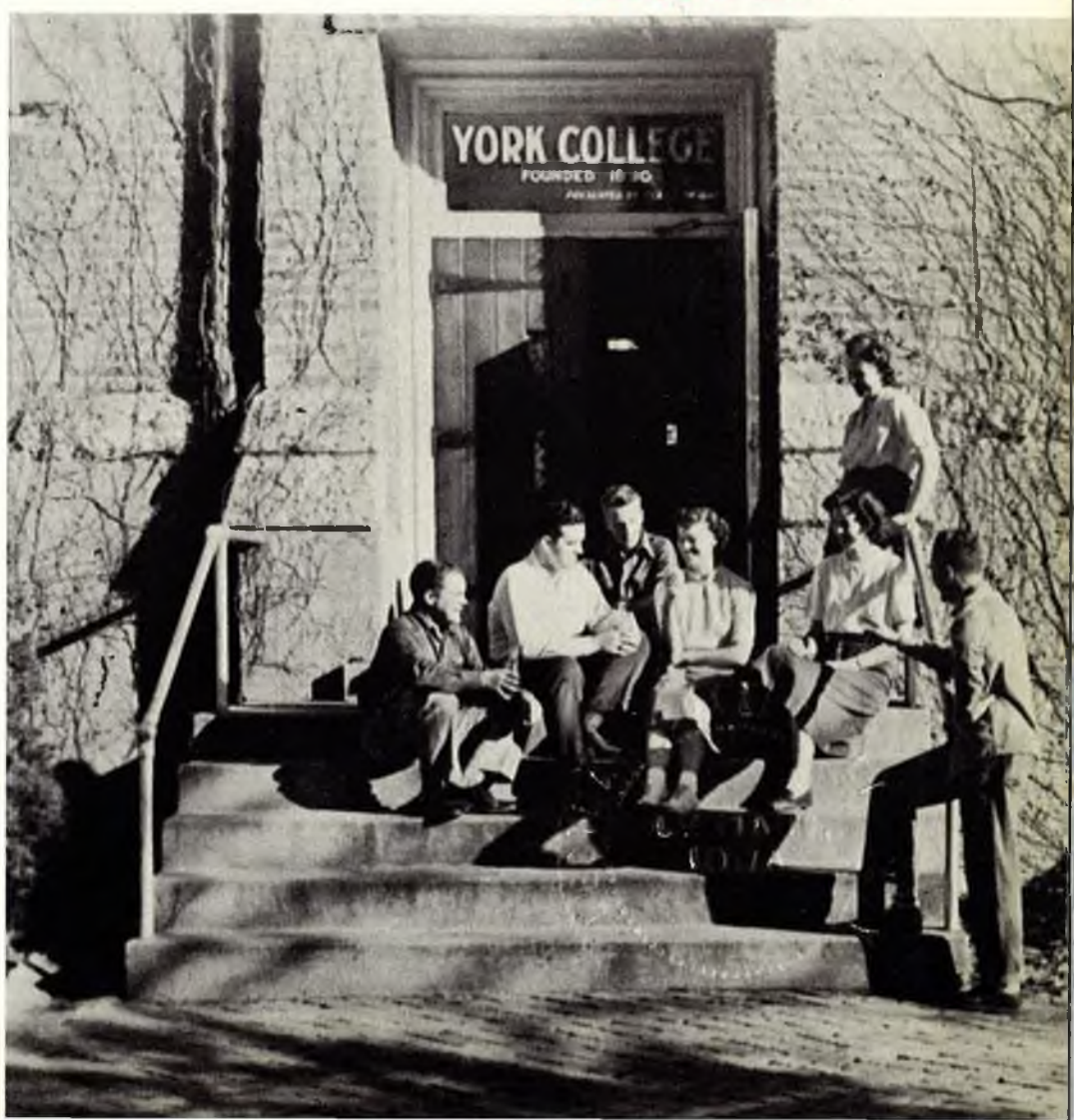

He has achieved, in one lifetime, the positions of Pastor, Chaplain, Missionary, and College Professor.

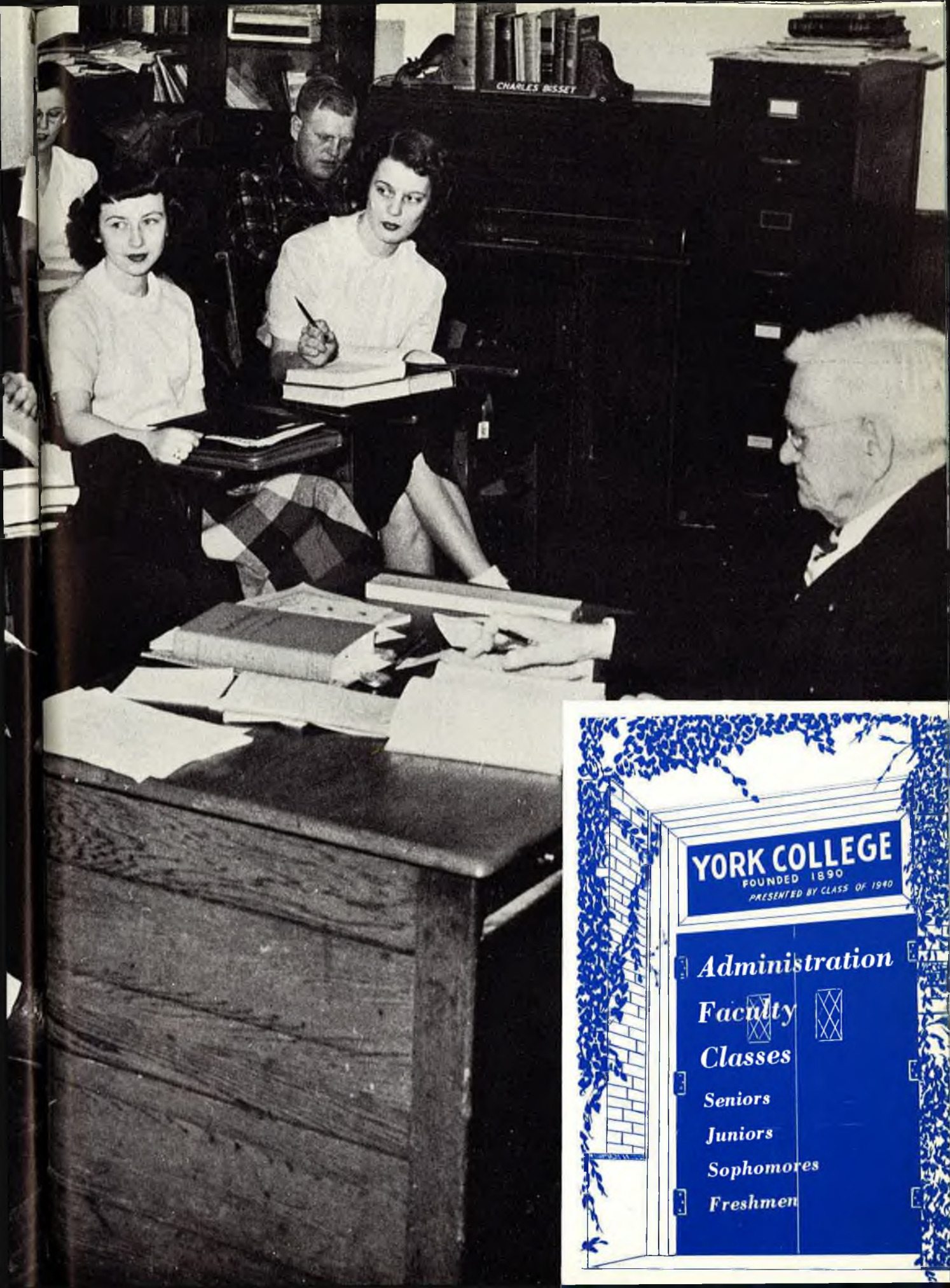

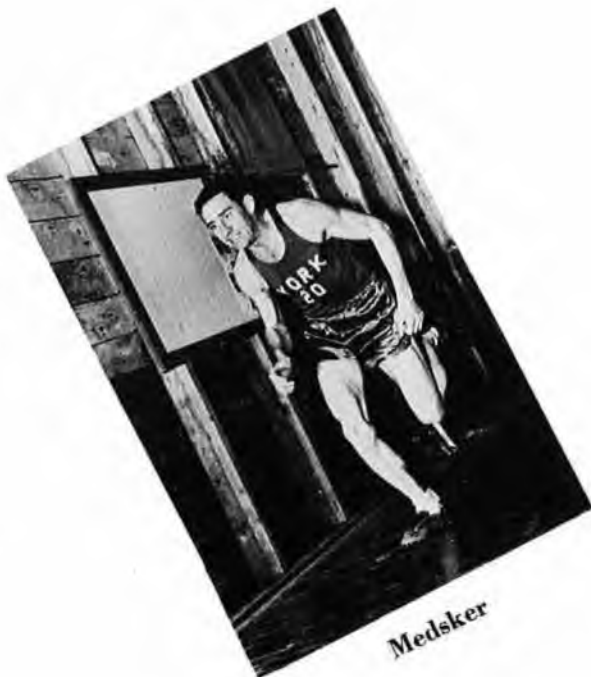

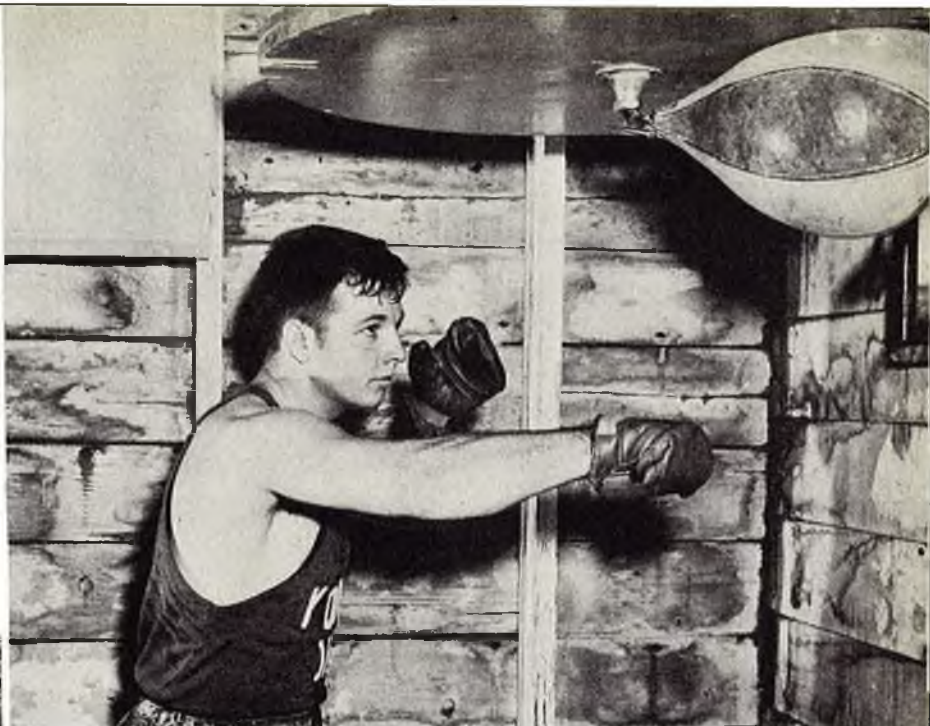

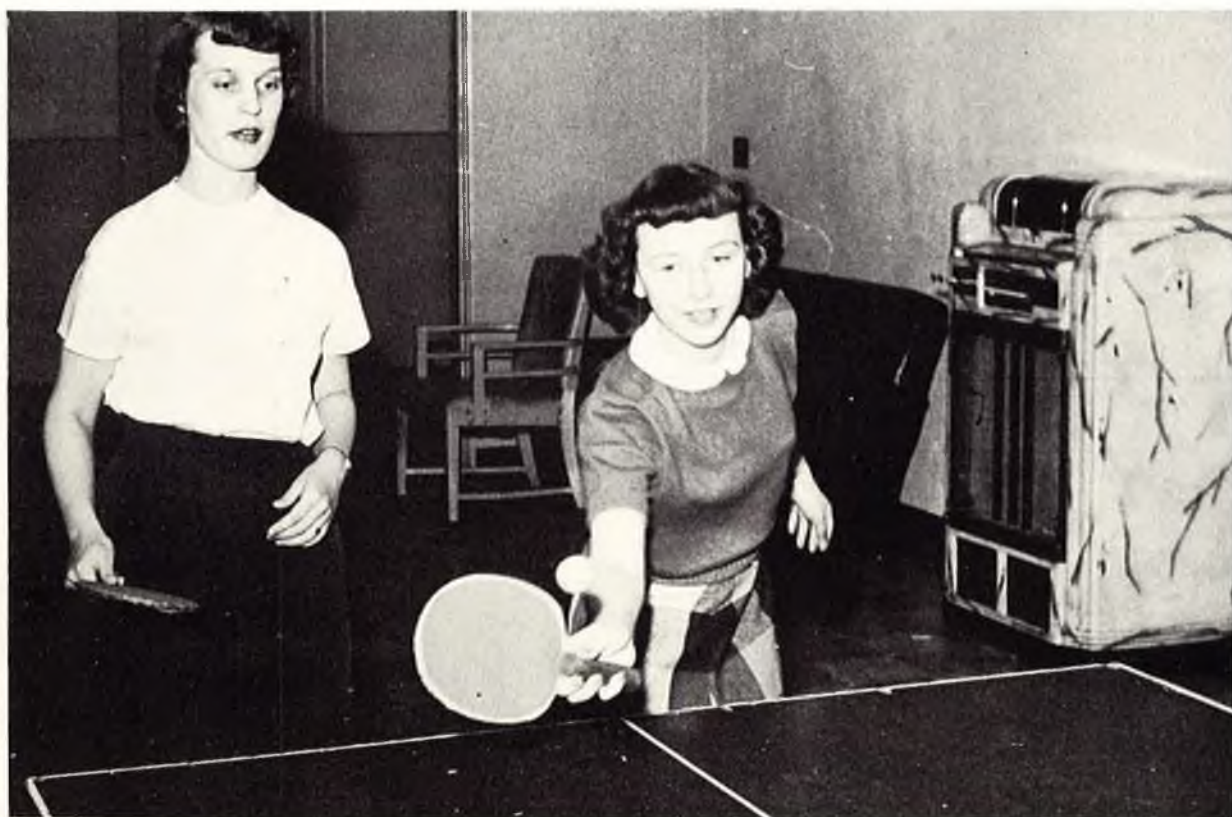
