

## York University President Job Description

The York University President is the chief executive officer of the university and serves at the direction of the board of trustees. The president, in collaboration with the board, is responsible for developing and executing strategic plans in alignment with the mission of the university.

The president is to ensure the university's full compliance with all board policies and priorities. This includes but is not limited to, ensuring that the university remains financially sound and that accreditation standards are fully maintained.

The president is responsible for developing annual budgets and operating the campus within the constraints of that budget. The president is also charged with maintaining a fundraising program sufficient to meet or exceed budgetary requirements.

Through appropriate administrators, the president oversees the recruitment, development, direction, and retention of all faculty and staff. The president's direct reports currently include the following:

- Provost
- Vice President for Finance and Operations
- Vice President for Advancement
- Vice President for Enrollment
- Vice President for Student Life
- Director of Athletics
- Campus Minister

In addition to the board of trustees, the president also serves the following constituencies: the faculty and staff; the students; alumni; donors; student parents; and the surrounding York community. In order to serve these constituencies, the president must exercise the leadership, management, administrative, fiscal, spiritual, and relational skills to draw these diverse groups together so that the mission of the university is fulfilled.
